Recent Releases or Soon-to-Be Released

Becoming Brianna by Terri Libenson – Fans of Raina Telgemeier will enjoy reading Bri's tale of finding confidence.

Clean Getaway by Nic Stone – An 11-year old boy on the great American road trip with his grandma learns about race relations in America.

Echo Mountain by Lauren Wolk – Ellie's family relocates to Echo Mountain during The Great Depression; she meets the hag who may help heal her father and heal the wounds of the past.

We Dream of Space by Erin Entrada Kelly – Told from three different points of view of seventh-grade siblings growing up in 1986 Delaware at the time of the Challenger space shuttle launch.

The Space Between Lost and Found by Sandy Stark-McGinnis – Cassie plans one last adventure as her mother begins to lose her memories due to Alzheimer's.

On the Horizon by Lois Lowry – Told in verse, this story recounts the tragedies of Pearl Harbor and Hiroshima.

When Stars are Scattered by Victoria Jamieson and Omar Mohamed – Graphic novel tells the story of Omar and his nonverbal brother Hassan living in a refugee camp in Kenya.

Black Brother, Black Brother by Jewell Parker Rhodes – Two brothers – one presenting as Black, the other presenting as White – train for a fencing competition and fight against racism.

The Deceivers by Margaret Peterson Haddix – Second book in a series, the Greystone kids must travel back to the other world to rescue family and friends.

The List of Things that Will Not Change by Rebecca Stead – Bea's parents are divorced, and her father is marrying his boyfriend. Lots of things will change, and other never will.

The Only Black Girls in Town by Brandy Colbert – Alberta and Edie discover journals that lead them to solve a mystery that will reveal secrets about the past.

Things Seen from Above by Shelley Pearsall – Joey and April join forces as outsiders.

We Could Be Heroes by Margaret Finnegan – Hank and Maisie team up to rescue a neighborhood dog.

City Spies by James Ponti – Five kids from around the world join forces to stop evil villains.

Prairie Lotus by Linda Sue Park – Hanna – a half-Asian girl living on the prairie in 1880 – faces prejudice from townspeople.

Race to the Sun by Rembecca Roanhorse – Navajo girl discovers she's a monster slayer.

The First Conspiracy by Brad Heltzer – Investigation into the alleged plot to kill George Washington in the early days of the Revolutionary War.

Scary Stories for Young Foxes by Christian McKay Heidicker – 8 interwoven haunting stories centered around two foxes Mia and Uly.

The Bridge Home by Padma Venkatraman – Four homeless children use their instincts to survive and make a life for themselves in India.

The Distance Between Me and the Cherry Tree by Paola Peretti – A young girl struggles to come to terms with losing her sight.

Stargazing by Jen Wang – The story of an unlikely friendship between Moon and Christine growing up in a Chinese-American suburb.

Beverly, Right Here by Kate Kicamillo – Third book about The Three Rancheros, this story tells the runaway tale of Beverly Tapinski.
